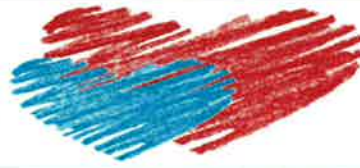

FOOD PANTRY

The suggested food items:

~Rice, grits, spaghetti noodles, boxed macaroni & cheese dinners

~Canned meats such as salmon, beef stew, spaghetti sauce with meat, ham, tuna, chicken, Vienna sausage, chicken & dumplings, corned beef hash, spaghetti and meatballs, ravioli, beef-a-roni,

~Canned vegetables and fruits, peanut butter, jelly, canned milk, juice boxes

~Crackers, dry cereal, powdered milk, pop-tarts, instant mashed potatoes
